## SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Whitney R. Leeman and Wild Eye Designs, Inc.

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Whitney R. Leeman, Ph.D. ("Leeman") on one hand, and Wild Eye Designs, Inc. on the other ("Wild"), with Leeman and Wild collectively referred to as the "Parties." Leeman is an individual residing in California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances contained in consumer products. Leeman alleges that Wild employs ten or more persons and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health \& Safety Code $\$ \$ 25249.5$ et seq. ("Proposition 65 ").

### 1.2 General Allegations

Leeman alleges that Wild has manufactured, imported, distributed and/or sold in the State of California glass oil and vinegar bottles with exterior designs containing lead. Lead is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

### 1.3 Product Description

The products that are covered by this Settlement Agreement are defined as glass oil and vinegar bottles with exterior designs containing lead, including but not limited to the, Wink Science Oil \& Vinegar Dispensers Set of Two, W OILV 484, \#0767 39187805 UPC \#6 65613 205282 , which are manufactured, imported, distributed, sold and/or offered for sale by Wild in the State of California, hereinafter the "Products."

### 1.4 Notice of Violation

On October 28, 2015, Leeman served Wild and various public enforcement agencies with a document entitled "60-Day Notice of Violation" ("Notice") that provided the recipients with notice that Wild was in alleged violation of California Health \& Safety Code $\$ 25249.6$ for
failing to warn consumers that the Products exposed users in California to lead. No public enforcer has diligently prosecuted the allegations set forth in the Notice.

### 1.5 No Admission

The partied enter into a full and final settlement of all claims raised in the notice. Wild denies the material, factual and legal allegations contained in Leeman's Notice and maintains that all products that it has sold and distributed in California, including the Products, have been and are in compliance with all laws, and are completely safe for their intended use. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by Wild of any fact, finding, issue of law or violation of law; nor shall compliance with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by Wild of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law. However, this section shall not diminish or otherwise affect the obligations, responsibilities and duties under this Settlement Agreement.

### 1.6 Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean March 15, 2016.

## 2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION AND WARNINGS

### 2.1 Reformulation Standards

Reformulated Products are defined as those Products containing a maximum of 100 parts per million of lead by weight in any exterior decoration when analyzed pursuant to Environmental Protection Agency testing methodologies 3050B and/or 6010B, and that yield a result of less than 1.0 micrograms of lead when analyzed pursuant to the NIOSH 9100 testing protocol.

### 2.2 Reformulation Commitment

As of the Effective Date, Wild shall not manufacture, import, or purchase, the Products for sale in the State of California unless they are Reformulated Products pursuant to Section 2.1 above, or shall carry the Proposition 65 warnings specified in Section 2.3 below.

### 2.3 Product Warnings

Wild shall provide clear and reasonable warnings for all Products manufactured, imported, or purchased for sale after the Effective Date as set forth in subsections 2.3(a) and (b) for all products that do not qualify as Reformulated Products. Each warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness as compared with other words, statements, designs, or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under customary conditions before purchase or use. Each warning shall be provided in a manner such that the consumer or user understands to which specific Product the warning applies, so as to minimize the risk of consumer confusion.

## (a) Retail Store Sales.

(i) Product Labeling. Wild shall affix a warning to the packaging, labeling, or directly on each Product provided for sale in retail outlets in California that states:

WARNING: This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.
(ii) Point-of-Sale Warnings. Alternatively, Wild may provide warning signs in the form below to its customers in California with instructions to post the warnings in close proximity to the point of display of the Products. Such instruction sent to Wild's customers shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.

WARNING: This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

Where more than one Product is sold in proximity to other like items or to those that do not require a warning (e.g., Reformulated Products as defined in Section 2.1), the following statement shall be used: ${ }^{1}$

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## WARNING: The following products contain a chemical, known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm: <br> [list products for which warning is required]

(b) Mail Order Catalog and Internet Sales. In the event that Wild sells Products via mail order catalog and/or the internet, to individuals and customers located in California, after the Effective Date, that are not Reformulated Products, Wild shall provide warnings for such Products sold via mail order catalog or the internet to California residents. Warnings given in the mail order catalog or on the internet shall identify the specific Product to which the warning applies as further specified in Sections 2.3(b)(i) and (ii).
(i) Mail Order Catalog Warning. Any warning provided in a mail order catalog shall be in the same type size or larger than the Product description text within the catalog. The following warning shall be provided on the same page and in the same location as the display and/or description of the Product:

WARNING: This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

Where it is impracticable to provide the warning on the same page and in the same location as the display and/or description of the Product, Wild may utilize a designated symbol to cross reference the applicable warning and shall define the term "designated symbol" with the following language on the inside of the front cover of the catalog or on the same page as any order form for the Product(s):

WARNING: Certain products identified with this symbol $\bar{\nabla}$ and offered for sale in this catalog contain a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

The designated symbol must appear on the same page and in close proximity to the display and/or description of the Product. On each page where the designated symbol appears, Wild must provide a header or footer directing the consumer to the warning language and definition of the designated symbol.
(ii) Internet Website Warning. A warning shall be given in conjunction with the sale of the Products via the internet, which warning shall appear either: (a) on the same web page on which a Product is displayed; (b) on the same web page as the order form for a Product; (c) on the same page as the price for any Product; or (d) on one or more web pages displayed to a purchaser during the checkout process. The following warning statement shall be used and shall appear in any of the above instances adjacent to or immediately following the display, description, or price of the Product for which it is given in the same type size or larger than the Product description text:

WARNING: This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.
Alternatively, the designated symbol may appear adjacent to or immediately following the display, description, or price of the Product for which a warning is being given, provided that the following warning statement also appears elsewhere on the same web page, as follows:

WARNING: This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

## 3. PENALTIES PURSUANT TO HEALTH \& SAFETY CODE $\$ 25249.7$ (b)

In settlement of all the claims referred to in this Settlement Agreement, Wild shall pay a total of $\$ 9,000$ in civil penalties in accordance with this Section. Each penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health \& Safety Code § 25249.12(c)(1) \& (d), with 75\% of the funds remitted to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") and the remaining $25 \%$ of the penalty remitted to Leeman, as follows:

### 3.1 Initial Civil Penalty

Wild shall pay an initial civil penalty in the amount of $\$ 3,000$ on or before the Effective Date. Wild shall issue the check to: "Whitney R. Leeman, Client Trust Account" in the amount of $\$ 3,000$. Leeman and her counsel will then ensure the proper portion of the payment is made to OEHHA. All penalty payments shall be delivered to the addresses listed in Section 3.3 below.

### 3.2 Final Civil Penalty

Wild shall pay a final civil penalty of $\$ 6,000$ on or before January 30,2017 . The final civil penalty shall be waived in its entirety, however, if, no later than January 15, 2017, an officer of Wild provides Leeman with written certification that, as of the date of such certification and continuing into the future, Wild has met the reformulation standard specified in Section 2.1 above, such that all Products manufactured, imported, distributed, sold and offered for sale in California by Wild are Reformulated Products. Leeman must receive any such certification on or before January 15,2017 . The certification in lieu of a final civil penalty payment provided by this Section is a material term, and time is of the essence. Wild shall issue a check for its final civil penalty payments to "Whitney R. Leeman, Client Trust Account" in the amount of \$6,000.

### 3.3 Payment Procedures

3.3.1. Issuance of Payments. Payments shall be delivered as follows:

## 4. REIMBURSEMENT OF FEES AND COSTS

The parties acknowledge that Leeman and her counsel offered to resolve this dispute without reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving this fee issue to be resolved after the material terms of the agreement had been settled. Wild then expressed a desire to resolve the fee and cost issue shortly after the other settlement terms had been finalized. The parties then attempted to (and did) reach an accord on the compensation due to Leeman and her counsel under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine codified at California Code of Civil Procedure $\S 1021.5$, for all work performed through the mutual execution of this agreement. Wild shall pay a total of $\$ 20,000$ for
any and all fees and costs incurred as a result of investigating, bringing this matter to Wild's attention, and negotiating a settlement in the public interest. Wild shall make two payments, first, on or before the Effective Date in the amount of $\$ 10,000$. Second, on or before June 1, 2016, Wild shall make a payment of $\$ 10,000$. Wild shall make each check payable to "The Chanler Group" and shall deliver payments to the address listed in Section 3.3.1 above.

## 5. RELEASES

### 5.1 Leeman's Release of Wild

This Settlement Agreement is a full, final and binding resolution between Leeman and Wild of any violation of Proposition 65 that was or could have been asserted by Leeman on behalf of herself and not on behalf of the public, and on behalf of her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and/or assignees, against Wild, its parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, employees, attomeys and each entity to whom Wild directly or indirectly distributes or sells Products including, but not limited to, downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative members and licensees ("Releasees"), based on their failure to warn about alleged exposures to lead contained in the Products that were manufactured, imported, or purchased for sale by Wild in California before the Effective Date. In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, Leeman on behalf of herself and not on behalf of the public, her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and/or assignees, hereby waives all of her rights to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of legal action and releases all claims that she may have including, without limitation, all actions, and causes of action, in law or in equity, suits, liabilities, demands, obligations, damages, costs, fines, penalties, losses or expenses -- including, but not limited to, investigation fees, expert fees and attorneys' fees, -limited to and arising under Proposition 65 with respect to lead in the Products manufactured, imported, or purchased for sale by Wild before the Effective Date (collectively "claims"), against Wild and Releasees.

### 5.2 Wild's Release of Leeman

Wild, on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and/or assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Leeman and her attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made (or those that could have been taken or made) by Leeman and her attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims, otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter or with respect to the Products.

## 6. SEVERABILITY

If, subsequent to the execution of this Settlement Agreement, any of the provisions of this Settlement Agreement are deemed by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the enforceable provisions remaining shall not be adversely affected.

## 7. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or if any of the provisions of this Settlement Agreement are rendered inapplicable or no longer required as a result of any such repeal or preemption or rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally as to the Products, then Wild shall provide written notice to Leeman of any asserted change in the law and shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted to relieve Wild from any obligation to comply with any other state or federal toxics control law.

## 8. NOTICES

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notices required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and: (i) personally delivered; (ii) sent by firstclass (registered or certified mail) return receipt requested; or (iii) sent by overnight courier, to one party by the other party at the following addresses:

## 10. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE AND SIGNATURES

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or pdf signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

## 11. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH \& SAFETY CODE \& 25249.7(f)

Leeman agrees to comply with the reporting requirements referenced in Health \& Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

## 12. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by a written agreement of the Parties.

## 13. AUTHORIZATION

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement and have read, understood and agree to all of the terms and conditions contained herein.
