SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

1. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1.1 John Moore and JS Products, Inc.

This Settlement Agreement (Settlement Agreement) is entered into by and between John Moore (Moore) and JS Products, Inc. ("JS") with Moore and JS collectively referred to as the "Parties." Moore is an individual residing in California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances contained in consumer products. JS employs ten or more persons and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.5 et seq. (Proposition 65).

1.2 General Allegations

Moore alleges that JS manufactures, imports, sells and/or distributes for sale in California, products containing di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate (DEHP), and that it does so without providing the health hazard warning that Moore alleges is required by Proposition 65. DEHP is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.

1.3 **Product Description**

The products that are covered by this Settlement Agreement are portfolios with vinyl/PVC components containing DEHP including, but not limited to, the *Kobalt Contractor's Portfolio with Tablet Storage, Item #0549809, Model #87552, LW013001-022014, UPC #0 99198 87552 1* that are manufactured, imported, distributed, sold and/or offered for sale by JS in the State of California, hereinafter the "Products."

1.4 Notice of Violation

On or about February 14, 2018, Moore served JS, and certain requisite public enforcement agencies with a 60-Day Notice of Violation (Notice), alleging that JS violated Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California that the Products expose users to DEHP. To the best of the Parties' knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting the allegations set forth in the Notice.

1.5 No Admission

JS denies the material, factual and legal allegations contained in the Notice and maintains that all products that it has sold and distributed in California, including the Products, have been and are in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by JS of any fact, finding, issue of law or violation of law; nor shall compliance with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by JS of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law. This Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect the obligations, responsibilities and duties under this Settlement Agreement.

1.6 Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean September 7, 2018.

2. <u>INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION AND WARNINGS</u>

2.1 <u>Reformulation Standards</u>

"Reformulated Products" are Products containing DEHP in concentrations of less than 0.1 percent (1,000 parts per million) in each accessible component when analyzed by a laboratory accredited by the State of California, a federal agency, or a nationally recognized accrediting organization. For purposes of compliance with this reformulation standard, testing samples shall be prepared and extracted using Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) methodology CPSC-CH-C1001.09.3 and analyzed using U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) methodology 8270D, or other methodologies utilized by federal or state government agencies to determine phthalate content in a solid substance.

2.2 Reformulation Commitment

As of the Effective Date, JS shall not manufacture, import, distribute, sell or offer the Products for sale in the State of California unless they are Reformulated Products pursuant to Section 2.1 above, or shall carry appropriate health hazard warnings per Section 2.3, below.

2.3 **Product Warnings**

Commencing on or before the Effective Date, JS shall provide clear and reasonable warnings for all Products that do not qualify as Reformulated Products. Each warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness as compared with other words, statements, designs, or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under customary conditions before purchase or use. Each warning shall be provided in a manner such that the consumer or user understands to which *specific* Product the warning applies, so as to minimize the risk of consumer confusion. For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the warning content and methods of transmission set forth in subsections 2.3(a) and (b) herein, and displayed or transmitted according to the above criteria and shall be deemed clear and reasonable.

(a) Retail Store Sales.

- (i) Product Labeling. JS shall affix a warning to the packaging, labeling, or directly on each Product provided for sale in retail outlets in California that states:
 - ⚠ WARNING: This product can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.
- (ii) Point-of-Sale Warnings. Alternatively, JS may provide warning signs in the form below to its customers in California with instructions to post the warnings in close proximity to the point of display of the Products. Such instruction sent to JS's customers shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.

WARNING: This product can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

Where more than one Product is sold in proximity to other like items or to those that do not require a warning (e.g., Reformulated Products as defined in Section 2.1), the following statement shall be used:1

WARNING: The following products can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

[list products for which warning is required]

- (b) Mail Order Catalog and Internet Sales. In the event that JS sells Products via mail order catalog and/or the internet, to customers located in California, after the Effective Date, that are not Reformulated Products, JS shall provide warnings for such Products sold via mail order catalog or the internet to California residents. Warnings given in the mail order catalog or on the internet shall identify the specific Product to which the warning applies as further specified in Sections 2.3(b)(i) and (ii).
- Mail Order Catalog Warning. Any warning provided in a mail order (i) catalog shall be in the same type size or larger than the Product description text within the catalog. The following warning shall be provided on the same page and in the same location as the display and/or description of the Product:

WARNING: This product can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

Where it is impracticable to provide the warning on the same page and in the same location as the display and/or description of the Product, JS may utilize a designated symbol to

¹For purposes of the Settlement Agreement, "sold in proximity" shall mean that the Product and another similar product are offered for sale close enough to each other that the consumer, under customary conditions of purchase, could not reasonably determine which of the two products is subject to the warning sign.

cross reference the applicable warning and shall define the term "designated symbol" with the following language on the inside of the front cover of the catalog or on the same page as any order form for the Product(s):

⚠ WARNING: Certain products identified with this symbol ▼ can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

The designated symbol must appear on the same page and near the display and/or description of the Product. On each page where the designated symbol appears, JS must provide a header or footer directing the consumer to the warning language and definition of the designated symbol.

(ii) Internet Website Warning. A warning shall be given in conjunction with the sale of the Products via the internet, which warning shall appear either: (a) on the same web page on which a Product is displayed; (b) on the same web page as the order form for a Product; (c) on the same page as the price for any Product; or (d) on one or more web pages displayed to a purchaser during the checkout process. The following warning statement shall be used and shall appear in any of the above instances adjacent to or immediately following the display, description, or price of the Product for which it is given in the same type size or larger than the Product description text:

WARNING: This product can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

Alternatively, where it is impracticable to provide the warning on the same page and in the same location as the display and/or description of the Product, JS may utilize a designated symbol to cross reference the applicable warning with a "designated symbol" which may appear adjacent to or immediately following the display, description, or price of the Product for which a warning is being given, provided that the following warning statement also appears elsewhere on the same web page, as follows:

⚠ WARNING: Certain products identified with this symbol ▼ can expose you to DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

(iii) Alternative Warning Language: JS may also use other warning content and transmission methods that conform to the provisions of California Code of Regulations Article 6, section 25600, and following, as amended on August 30, 2016, and subsequently thereafter, or any other regulations that set forth warning language and transmission methods deemed to be clear and reasonable as required by California Health & Safety Code §25249.6.

3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS

3.1 Payments Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b)(2)

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b)(2), and in settlement of all claims alleged in the Notice or referred to in this Settlement Agreement, JS agree to pay a total of \$2,000.00 in civil penalties. The penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health and Safety Code § 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the penalty amount paid to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) and the remaining 25% of the penalty amount retained by Moore.

JS will deliver their payment on or before five business days after each party has received this agreement fully executed, in two checks for the following amounts made payable to: (a) "OEHHA" in the amount of \$1,500.00; and (b) "John Moore, Client Trust Account" in the amount of \$500.00. Moore's counsel shall be responsible for delivering OEHHA's portion of the penalties paid under this Settlement Agreement.3.2

3.2 Reimbursement of Attorneys' Fees and Costs

The Parties acknowledge that Moore and his counsel offered to resolve this dispute without reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving the issue to be resolved after the material terms of the agreement had been settled. Shortly after the other settlement terms had been finalized, JS expressed a desire to resolve Moore's fees and costs. The Parties then negotiated a resolution of the compensation due to

Moore and his counsel under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine codified at California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5. For all work performed through the mutual execution of this agreement, JS shall reimburse Moore and his counsel \$18,000. JS's payment shall be delivered to the address in Section 3.3, on or before five business days after each party has received this agreement fully executed, in the form of a check payable to "The Chanler Group." The reimbursement shall cover all fees and costs incurred by Moore investigating, bringing this matter to JS's attention and negotiating a settlement of the matter.

4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED

4.1 <u>Moore's Release of Proposition 65 Claims</u>

Moore acting on his own behalf, and *not* on behalf of the public, releases JS, its parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, agents employees, attorneys, and each entity to whom JS directly or indirectly distributes or sells Products, including, but not limited, to downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative members, and licensees (collectively, "Releasees"), from all claims for violations of Proposition 65 through the Effective Date based on unwarned exposures to DEHP in the Products, as set forth in the Notice. Compliance with the terms of this Settlement Agreement constitutes compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to exposures to DEHP from the Products, as set forth in the Notice. The Parties further understand and agree that this Section 4.1 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that manufactured the Products or any component parts thereof, or any distributors or suppliers who sold the Products or any component parts thereof to JS.

4.2 Moore's Individual Releases of Claims

Moore, in his individual capacity only and *not* in his representative capacity, provides a release herein which shall be effective as a full and final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities, and demands of Moore of any nature, character, or kind, whether known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, limited to and arising out of alleged or actual exposures to DEHP in the Products manufactured, imported, distributed, or sold by JS prior to the Effective Date. The Parties further understand and agree that this Section 4.2 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that manufactured the Products, or any component parts thereof, or any distributors or suppliers who sold the Products, or any component parts thereof to JS. Nothing in this Section affects Moore's right to commence or prosecute an action under Proposition 65 against a Releasee that does not involve JS's Products.

4.3 JS's Release of Moore

JS, on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Moore and his attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made (or those that could have been taken or made) by Moore and his attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims or otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against them in this matter with respect to the Products.

5. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If, subsequent to the execution of this Settlement Agreement, any of the provisions of this Settlement Agreement are deemed by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the enforceable provisions remaining shall not be adversely affected.

6. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or if any of the provisions of

this Settlement Agreement are rendered inapplicable or no longer required as a result of any such repeal or preemption or rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally as to the Products, then JS shall provide written notice to Moore of any asserted change in the law and shall have no further injunctive obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted to relieve JS from any obligation to comply with any pertinent state or federal toxics control law.

7. NOTICE

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notices required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and: (i) personally delivered; (ii) sent by first-class (registered or certified mail) return receipt requested; or (iii) sent by overnight courier, to one party by the other party at the following addresses:

Any party, from time to time, may specify in writing to the other party a change of address to which all notices and other communications shall be sent.

8. <u>COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE AND SIGNATURES</u>

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or pdf signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

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9. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 25249.7(f)

Moore agrees to comply with the reporting requirements referenced in Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

10. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by a written agreement of the Parties.

11. <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement and have read, understood and agree to all of the terms and conditions contained herein.
